Y10AFA1			<p>Artist journal page</p> <p><b>WALT:</b> Learning to produce a journal page. In mixed media</p> <p><b>TASK:</b> You are to produce a journal page that records one of your messages.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Using the inspiration from one of the artists that you have researched yourself so far <b>or</b> one from last week (Teesha Moore and Sarah Fishburn).</li> <li>It must be no smaller than A4.</li> <li>You must include a variety of media in your work (a minimum of 3 media)</li> <li>When adding text, colour, images or pattern or whatever you decide to do, consider how your chosen artists would do this.</li> </ul> <p><b>Analyse your artists work and then ask yourself the following questions:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>What Message or story does the artist try to convey? What message do I want to produce? (look at your mind map and see what you said you wanted to write messages or stories about)</b></li> <li><b>What materials do they use that I could use in my own work?</b></li> </ul>		

			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Why have they used a certain material and would that material be appropriate in my own work?</li> <li>• They may use newspapers, magazines, printed images, old books, fabric, envelopes or other recycled materials. You could consider using some of these in your work too.</li> <li>• How do they present their work? What creative ways could I present my work?</li> <li>• Does the message link to my mind map?</li> <li>• What style or styles of lettering does the artist produce? They may use cut out lettering, hand written lettering or typed lettering in their work.
